The Governor's budget for KHEAA includes funding to forgive student loans for those working in three fields: \$26 million each fiscal year for teachers, \$5 million each year for nurses, and \$2 million for social workers.

Higher Education Funding Note

In the Big Bold Ask, the Prichard Committee calls for increasing Kentucky's investment in public universities, KCTCS and performance funding by \$311 million per year by 2026. HB adds about \$56 million to those annual investments.
