## **Higher Education Funding Note**

In the Big Bold Ask, the Prichard Committee calls for increasing Kentucky's investment in public universities, KCTCS and performance funding by \$311 million per year by 2026. HB adds about \$56 million to those annual investments.

## Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholarship (KEES) Note

KEES is Kentucky's largest merit-based scholarship program. The funding shown above reflects the General Fund portion only from lottery receipts. HB 1 also calls for KEES to receive <u>restricted</u> funds of \$4,773,400 in FY 2023 and \$5,873,400 in FY 2024, adding additional revenue for merit scholarships

## College Access Program (CAP) Note

CAP scholarships are Kentucky's largest needs-based financial aid program. HB 1 increases that funding in each fiscal year. In the Big Bold Ask, the Prichard Committee calls for increasing Kentucky's investment in CAP by \$30 million per year by 2026, and HB 1 meets that goal by FY 2023.
